Pupil Premium

In 2011-12 the government introduced Pupil Premium Grant (PPG). This money is given to schools based on the number of children on roll who claim Free School Meals (FSM). During the academic year of 2012-2013, the criteria for eligibility have been expanded to include all children who have been eligible for FSMs in the past six years.

The money is allocated to initiatives to ensure pupils reach their full potential, academically, physically and socially.

In 2017-2018 the school estimates to receive £121.440 for PPG.

The money will be used to help provide for the following initiatives:

Specialist Teacher/s for Performing and Creative Arts.	£40,000.00	To develop and oversee the provision of 'the arts' across the school.	Pupils have benefitted immensely from a range of specialist provision.; specialist artist workshops, drama and dance. Children have had opportunities to develop their speaking and listening skills and apply these through drama and acting with a teachers and TA's via the Shakespeare Workshops and Production as well as extended day provision as part of Passion Projects. This allowed groups of pupils to make the most out of the Shakespeare festival that they participated in — with an outstanding performance that was well received by all schools and adults attending the event.
Intervention/Float Teacher	£35,000.00	To ensure that bespoke teaching opportunities enable the most vulnerable pupils to achieve their personal best.	 Bespoke coaching and mentoring sessions have been implemented to raise the outcomes for pupils in an identified area. The consistent bespoke provision of teaching and learning opportunities for the most vulnerable learners has enabled them to develop greater self-esteem with their learning; as they have an opportunity to engage in lessons in a more bespoke and purposefully set environment.
TA support	£40,000.00	To ensure that all pupils get daily, high quality support within classes and groups to enable them to make accelerated progress. To support pupils requiring further support in reading, writing and maths — this includes pupils working below and above age expected levels at the end of each	 CPD for TA's in the PA maths programme has was put in place for those who had not yet attended. CPD in Colourful Semantics and S & L and Lego Therapy have also contributed to TA's developing their confidence and skills when working with groups of pupils; thereby maximising the input for pupils during these sessions. TA's have been attending the CPD sessions designed to build confidence when using the iPad so they are able to fully support lessons in classes.
