What is the Sports Premium?

The Department for Education (DfE) are spending over £450 million on improving physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools over the 3 academic years. The funding was first issued for the academic year 2013/2014 and has on into the curent academic year. The funding will be allocated directly to primary school's to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all pupils.

Our school allocation

Our school has been awarded £ 14,053.00 for the academic year 2017-2018.

The money will be used to help provide for the following initiatives:

School Sports Coach Weekly competitive sports in school (trialled clubs) and additional well-being activities for those pupils not in class. Teams to be developed are: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Handball• Netball• Basketball	8000.00	The coaching delivered in school has provided children with high quality PE lessons and extra curricula activities. This includes the Passion Project for Sports Science delivered by the PE co-ordinator for KS2 pupils; where they have developed a deeper understanding of how health and fitness impacts all areas of one's mental and physical health; the demands of being a professional athlete.
To establish a school gardening and produce club.	1000.00	Children are developing an understanding for how the seasons effect the growing patterns of food types. They are involved in the planning and planting of gardens within the school for a range of purposes; pleasure and presentation, herbs for cooking and food (greens) for our farm animals.
Equipment (Cooking) - To facilitate the Healthy Options aspect of the PE curriculum:	2000.00	A wide range of opportunities are made available for all children to engage in hands on cooking across all key stages. These lessons are all delivered by our School Chef and are either linked to units of study within classes or as part of Passion Project foci for KS2 pupils – such as Street Food, or “A tour of Italy” where pupils learnt to make a range of pasta types, sauces and more importantly eat all that they had made (occasionally some sample even made it home!).
Co-ordinator Release - PE	1500.00	Release for co-ordinator to complete inter-school competitions, external sports link hubs (Arsenal), applications and evidence for completing Healthy Schools Award of which Bronze has been awarded and we are successfully on track for Silver.
Equipment	1553.20	New playground equipment has been provided for KS1 and KS2 which has resulted in greater child engagement and a wider range of mixed activities on offer for pupils during break times throughout the day.
