School Sports Coach	6000.00	To continue to provide high quality well planned lessons for pupils with the opportunity to develop not only skills but tactical and team building skills needed within a wide range of PE activities. To provide pupils who are successfully selected from trials to participate in school representative teams. To attend and participate in a wide range of inter school and wider borough competitions 9including the Arsenal Hub sessions).
After School Clubs including Dance, Gardening and Cooking.	5300.00	To provide a range of daily after school clubs that pupils from across the school can access in their respective key stages each week. These clubs provide: • additional opportunities to practice and refine sports skills • participating in less competitive clubs that focus on co-operative learning, team building and participation • developing opportunities for creative movement and expression (dace) • broadening opportunities to learn and or develop further a range of practical skills and fun ways of using skills such as maths though cooking and baking.

Co-ordinator Release - PE	1000.00	To facilitate in the continued development of high quality PE across the school including the attainment of Healthy Schools Gold Award and working towards the School Games Kite Mark Award.
Equipment: • Fencing	5000.00	To replace, renew, repair or enhance sports equipment on offer for PE lessons and or playgrounds. To establish fencing as a new After School Club after a term of introudcing to pupils in KS2.
