In Maths this week we have been learning about about sharing objects into equal groups. We practised by sharing the dinosaurs between us and then we counted to check they were equal. 🦖




YEAR 1H

We have been combining Maths and Art, creating our own pieces of art in the cubism style. We used 2D shapes and rulers.




YEAR 2


YEAR 3


YEAR 4

Following on from our awesome trip to the Natural History Museum, Year 4 have been using the Sketches School app to niftily trace over maps of the continents and tectonic plate boundaries. We then removed the backgrounds and used Explain Everything to overlay and label them. Now we can see where the plates have pushed up the land masses and also where the majority of tectonic activity occurs.
