
NURSERY

We read 'Whatever Next' we then wrote about what happened in the story.




RECEPTION T

We conducted an experiment! We planted seeds and exposed some to sun, some to water, some to soil and some to all three! Which seeds do you think will grow?




YEAR 1H

It took some time but we finally learnt how to plait.




YEAR 1T
