We enjoyed making hot air balloons for our reading corner. Make sure to have a look as all our books are heading up to the sky!




NURSERY

YEAR 1H

YEAR 1T

YEAR 2

In our Science topic, Living Things we sorted different animals into their different categories looking closely at their characteristics. We have also been looking at animal diets using scientific language to identify whether animals were herbivores, carnivores or omnivores.




YEAR 3

Continuing the theme of living things, we made observational drawings of a wide variety of fruits and flowers. We looked closely at the arrangement of seeds and flower parts and discovered that it is the ovary of a flower that eventually becomes the fruit.



YEAR 4

We have been writing diary entries based on the story *The Wreck Of The Zanzibar* by Michael Morpurgo. We used the text to think about the different problems facing the main character, and then used these to inspire our own diary entries set on the beautiful Isles of Scilly in the 1920s. We learnt to use the 'show not tell' technique to convey our characters emotions and mastered first person language to write directed speech.




YEAR 5

We have been learning about life cycles. We have then chosen an animal and created their life cycle.



YEAR 6

In preparation for writing our own thank you letter next week, we have been annotating the key features of a letter using the Explain Everything app. We highlighted modal verbs, adverbs, determiners, onomatopoeia, noun phrases and alliteration. We were also able to identify aspects of punctuation such as ellipsis, exclamation marks and commas.
